## **Digital Cadastral Database (DCDB)**

Over the last few years Lands has engaged in a major systems re-engineering process to integrate spatial data using contemporary database technologies. The latest outcome of this process is that online access to the standard Digital Cadastral Database (DCDB) dataset, baseline supply and incremental update capabilities are now available. ## Electronic Service Delivery Questionnaire

We are currently developing systems to provide clients with automated online updates of DCDB and other spatial data. To roll out this service effectively, we would like to know more about clients' IT infrastructure and preferred delivery mechanisms. It is important that organisations requiring access to the DCDB complete the questionnaire to provide us with an accurate understanding of their technical capabilities and requirements. ### **DCDB Maintenance**

LPI Circular 2004/11 "Suspension of maintenance of the Digital Cadastral Database (DCDB) during database upgrading", issued in July 2004, explained arrangements for application of DCDB data changes held over during system migration. Lands can advise that DCDB maintenance has now resumed. Currently, approximately 75% of the update backlog jobs have been processed to completion with a further 10% presently undergoing processing. The backlog is expected to be cleared by the end of August, 2005.
